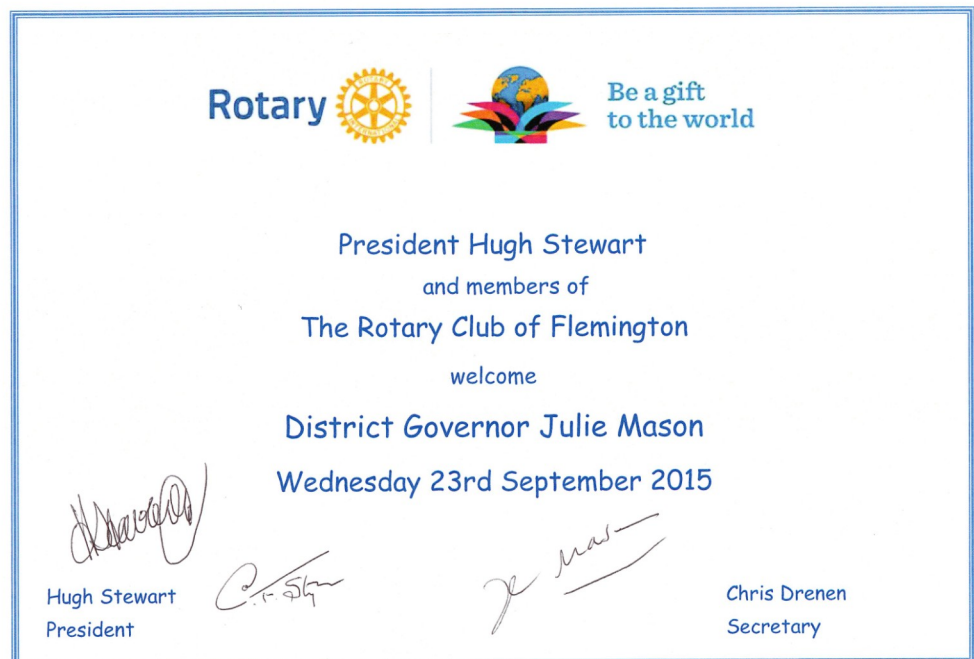

The Venny is a communal backyard and play space for children aged five to 16 years from the Kensington public housing estate and surrounding areas. As Danielle said, *"It provides a great sense of cohesion in the community, ... it provides early intervention for a range of social issues, ... and children speak of the place as a home."*

We were pleased to donate \$500 to assist with the Permaculture Garden Plan developed for the centre, and will work on some ideas with Danielle and General Manager David Kutcher to provide further assistance.

District Governor's Visit to Flemington Rotary

Julie was warmly welcomed by members and guests, as a former Assistant Governor for our club and a long time friend. She began by saying what an honour it was to be elected as District Governor, and had worn the Chain of Office to show us some of the history of our District, the first in Australia and home to the first Rotary Club, the Rotary Club of Melbourne. She then passed the Chain around for members to view.

Julie then reminded us of her motto—You, Me, Us and of the Theme for the 2015-2016 Rotary year: “Be a Gift to the World”.

Julie refers to herself as a simply country girl who grew up in the Western District on a dairy farm. No barriers were seen to exist for her due to her gender—on a farm there was a sense of shared purpose and everyone pitched in for every job. She transferred that sense of community and doing good in the world to her role as a teacher and as a Principal in a very large school. She emphasised the need to bring people together and with friendship, to grow together, learn tolerance and enjoy friendship with service.

As District Governor she sees her role as:

- * promote a Member a Month campaign
- * explore new ideas
- * provide visible, timely, practical support for clubs

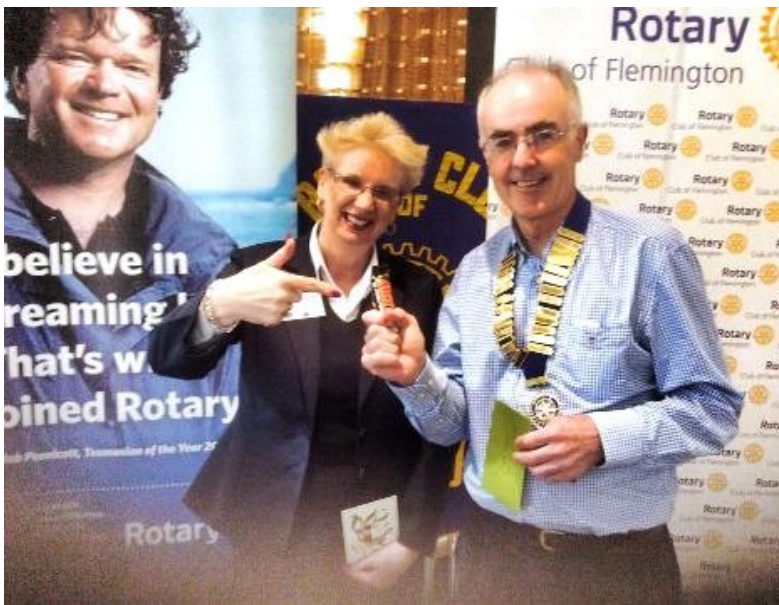
District Governor's Visit to Flemington Rotary

The key focus is on early intervention, before issues escalate, creating a home environment, providing food and mentoring young people in number of different programmes.

They are establishing a Venny garden, which will provide them with some vegetables, also it will assist children to see how they grow and learn about gardening. She asked the club if we can assist with gardening tools and building materials for this to happen. Hugh will speak with the Board to see if we can organise a club working bee to get this started. Hugh also gave Danielle a cheque for \$500 to assist the Venny.

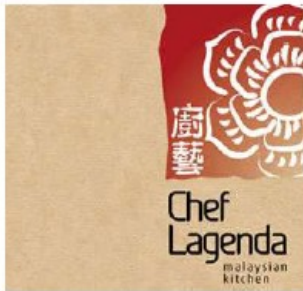

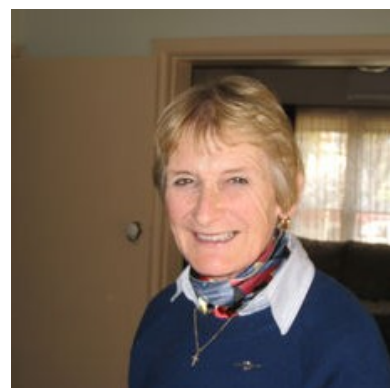

NOMINATING COMMITTEE TO ELECT DISTRICT GOVERNOR FOR 2018– 2019

This is a call for Clubs to nominate a Past President to serve on the Nominating Committee that will select a nominee for District Governor for the year 2018-2019. This is in accordance with RI Bylaw 13.010 approved at the 2007 Council on Legislation and the terms of reference as defined in District Resolution Number 1 of 2006.

The Nominating Committee shall consist of:

1. The District Governor as Chairman
2. The most recent Past District Governor available
3. The current District Governor Elect
4. The current District Governor Nominee
5. Three Past Presidents of Rotary Clubs in District 9800 (not being members of the same Club, Honorary Members or Past District Governors) elected by the Clubs in the District.

A Past President elected under (e.) shall not serve on the Nominating Committee for two successive years.

If more than three nominations are received to fill the positions under (e.) above, the District Governor shall arrange for a ballot of Clubs by mail to determine the three members required to serve on the Nominating Committee.

Nominations by Clubs of Past Presidents to serve on the Nominating Committee can be made by completing the attached form and returning a scanned copy to secretary@rotarydistrict9800.org.au by 30 Oct 2015.

The scheduled meeting date of the committee is Sunday 21 February 2016.

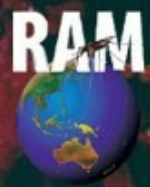
