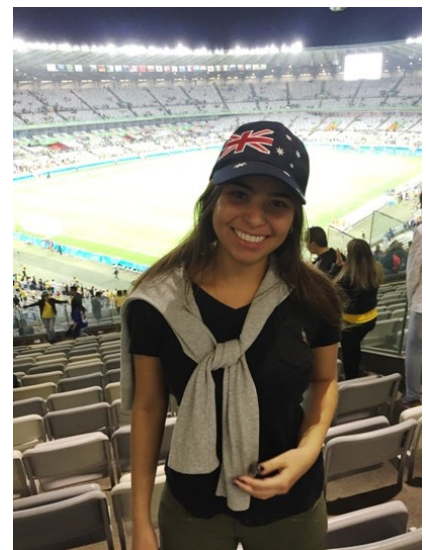

Guest Speaker Mary Keating—Flemington Kensington News

Mary Keating introduced herself as a long time Flemington resident and editor of the **Flemington Kensington News** for the past 10 years. Her grandchildren attended Flemington Primary School.

Mary previously worked in community organisations, managed aged care centres and completed a Graduate Diploma in Business to help her in working with teams.

The Flemington Kensington News is one of the last free community newspapers and is 40 years old, is published 4 times each year and prints 10,000 copies which are distributed across the Flemington, Kensington, North Melbourne, Traralgon areas.

The paper was founded by a group of Flemington residents who ran cake stalls to fund it in the early days. It is now funded by advertising which is limited by the constitution to 20% of space.

Local stories strengthen community and help form a more cohesive community. They publish stories interesting to the local area including from the 5 Primary Schools, 2 Secondary Schools, the community and neighbourhood houses, churches and local not for profit organisations. They have close relationships with local businesses and traders, real estate agents who will erect display boards for local events.

Today she would like to share with us and seek our support for a community project the paper would like to support. The project entails working with students from the Kensington Community School where they recently held a **Biggest**

Morning Tea. The 80 students are some of the most disadvantaged Mary has ever come across—they travel from as far away as Craigieburn and Werribee and generally have a learning disability or a behavioral condition which means they cannot learn in a typical school. They also lack confidence, organisational skills and resilience.

The Project is to encourage the students to create and write the youth pages for the paper. This would give them a skill, support their literacy and enable them to work on a real world activity. One of the School Council members has offered to support the project together with one of the Special Needs teachers.

Anthony Bartel was the previous Youth Section Editor. He is well known in the Flemington area and has T3 quadriplegia, and is in a wheelchair on life support. He now writes for Collingwood FC and went to Africa last year, making a documentary about living and travelling with disabilities. He has now stepped down

As detailed in the proposal which is circulating the room, Mary would like assistance to apply for and obtain a grant of \$8,000 which would enable them to fund 4 editions of the paper with help from one of their committee who has the skills. The school Principal Gary Power is supportive of this project.

The **Flemington Kensington News** has two big events coming up :

1. A Vicar of Dibley blessing of the animals at St Georges in Flemington is what it sounds like. When they ran it last year it attracted a very large crowd. They would love to have an elephant and a camel but may have to settle for some large dogs.
2. The other event is a fundraiser with author Helen Garner. This would attract a very large crowd and publicise the paper and what the committee are trying to do.

Geoff Cawsey then asked his 'burning' question re the paper's printing. Yes, the paper is still printed in the Latrobe Valley, at Moe to be precise. that printer assisted them when they first started and they have stayed with him. It would probably be cheaper to print in China,.

Peter Cribb asked about the number of HoA students at the school. Mary was unsure but Lesley advised about 25%.

Members were amazed at a photo of Peter Donnellan in one of the old copies of the newspaper. It appeared to have been taken about 30 years ago.

Allan Bruno browsed an old newspaper archive book and was amazed at notices for a Pub Crawl, public transport optional.

GROUP VOCATIONAL EXCHANGE TO D3280 PHILIPPINES 2017

TEAM MEMBERS REQUIRED – EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST INVITED

From mid-February to mid-March 2017, District 9800 will be conducting a four-week Group Vocational Exchange with District 3280 in the Philippines. The GVE team will be comprised of an experienced Rotarian team leader and four suitably qualified team members aged between 25 and 35 years to be sourced and put forward by D9800 Clubs for final selection by District interview on September 18 2016.

The team leader will be selected by separate process and is not part of this call for applicants.

The primary aim of the exchange is to expose each team member to four days in each of the four weeks away to vocational experiences relevant to their profession. At the same time, there will be deep cultural immersion in many aspects of the host country.

The theme of the exchange will be aligned with any of the RI Foundation areas of focus, namely:

- *Peace and conflict resolution
- *Maternal and Child Health
- *Water and Sanitation
- *Basic Education and Literacy
- *Economic and Community Development
- *Disease Prevention and Treatment.

In short, any person in the broad fields of medicine, or education, or engineering, or emergency services, or social services can be “suitably qualified” to be put forward for final selection.

In turn, in the same February/March period 2017, D9800 will be hosting a similarly composed team from the Philippines (team leader and four team members) for complementary vocational and cultural experiences.

The District Vocational Committee is arranging the vocational experiences, leaving the host Clubs to participate in and enjoy the cultural aspect.

Clearly that indicates that we need registration of willingness from four clubs (or Clusters) from around the District to provide families to home-host the visiting team members for one week each over the four weeks duration of the exchange.

Given that it may be that we have more Clubs interested than the four required, District must have the discretion to select those Clubs that amongst other things, geographically suit the vocational locations (not as yet determined) to maximise convenience and minimise travel time for both Club and student.

Sam Owori is selected to be 2018-19 Rotary President

The **2016-17 Nominating Committee** for **President of Rotary International** has unanimously nominated **Samuel Frobisher Owori**, of the Rotary Club of Kampala, Uganda, to be the president of Rotary International in 2018-19.

He will be declared the president-nominee on 1 October if no challenging candidates have been suggested.

Owori says he sees in Rotary "an incredible passion to make a difference." As president, he plans to "harness that enthusiasm and pride so that every project becomes the engine of peace and prosperity."

Owori's chief concerns as a Rotary leader are membership and extension. Since he served as district governor, the number of clubs in Uganda has swelled from nine to 89. He urges past, present, and future leaders to work together to engage more women, youth program participants, alumni, and community members to increase Rotary's membership in the coming years.



"There are many places which need Rotary and numerous potential members who have never been invited," he says. "The problem is Rotarians who got in and closed the doors."

Owori is chief executive officer of the Institute of Corporate Governance of Uganda. Before that, he was executive director of the African Development Bank, managing director of Uganda Commercial Bank Ltd., and director of Uganda Development Bank. He has studied law, employment relations, business management, corporate resources management, microfinance, and marketing at institutions in England, Japan, Switzerland, Tanzania, and the United States, including Harvard Business School.

Since becoming a member in 1978, Owori has served Rotary as regional Rotary Foundation coordinator, regional Rotary International membership coordinator, Rotary International Representative to the United Nations Environment Program and UN-Habitat, and Rotary International director. He has been a member or chair of several committees, including the **International PolioPlus Committee**, the **Drug Abuse Prevention Task Force**, and the **Audit Committee**. Most recently, Owori served as trustee of **The Rotary Foundation**, chair of **The Rotary Foundation's Finance Committee**, and a member of the **Investment Committee**. Owori is a **Benefactor of The Rotary Foundation**, and he and his wife, Norah, are Major Donors and Paul Harris Fellows.
